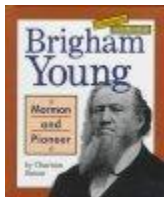


Celebrating Religious Diversity: Latter-Day Saints

Brigham Young : Mormon and pioneer **By Charnan Simon**

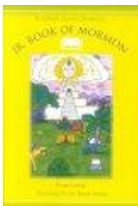
