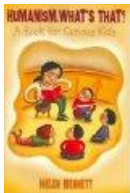


Celebrating Religious Diversity – Atheism and Humanism

Humanism, what's that? : a book for curious kids **By Helen Bennett**

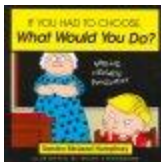
